

Land Pooling Policy – Vaarta and Samvad

Public Hearing was organized by DDA in Village Tigipur and Mohammadpur on 02.07.2022 to resolve the concerns of Land Owners/ Stakeholders by way of two-way communication.

The Land Pooling portal of DDA was opened by the department for the left out landowners of villages in **Sector-10A-Zone N**, **Sector 2 & 3 of Zone P-II** to express willingness to participate in all of the Land Pooling villages to become the part of consortium formation.

In the Sector- 2 & 3 of Zone P-II, Sector-10A-Zone N, the total pooled land have crossed the threshold of 70%, as has been mentioned in the land pooling policy – 2018 for consortium formation. With a view to going forward an Awareness and Interaction campaign- “**Vaarta & Samvad**” was organized with the Land Owners and Stakeholders. The venue for the campaign was Village Tigipur and Mohammadpur for Sector 2 of Zone P-II and Sector 3 of Zone P-II respectively on 02.07.2022.



The “Vaarta & Samvad” was organized by DDA, Land Pooling department, wherein Commissioner (Land Pooling) and Director (Land pooling) were present along with the DDA officials and the staff and interacted/communicated with more than 150 farmers/Land Owners/Stakeholders. In the said interactions, efforts were made to:

- Resolve their doubts and their concern by way of explaining the Land Pooling Policy for consortium formation and implementation at ground level.
- Communicate with the interested applicants and build trust among them with a view to collectively work towards making Land Pooling Policy a success.
- Reach out to the unpooled Land Owners/Developer Entities to convince them to pool their respective share of land against Land Pooling policy for holistic Development of their respective Sectors.
- Highlight the major benefits of planned development through Land Policy to contribute in the progress and development of Delhi for affordable housing and amenities for all.

- Discussions were held with respect to issues pertaining to the policy, the proposed amendments, the consortium formation modalities, the External Development Charge issue, the 60-40 division of land and the ground level implementation of Land Pooling Policy.

The villagers who attended the field camp have shown keen interest in collaborating with a view to making the Land Pooling Policy- a success. The discussion ended with a vote of thanks.
