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HON'BLE LG DELHI APPROVES DDA'S ANNUAL BUDGET 2023-2024



The Delhi Development Authority (DDA) in its meeting chaired by Lt. Governor, Shri V.K. Saxena, who is also Chairman, DDA, took major decisions, including approval of Annual Budget 2023-24, with focus on civic infrastructure of the national capital, particularly Narela, Dwarka, and Rohini. The budget has special emphasis on UER-II, rejuvenation and restoration of Yamuna floodplains and green spaces. The Authority also approved pre-determined rates for Rohini, Phase IV and V, Tikri Kalan, and Narela, for financial year 2022-23 and permitted land use change for improving public transport system in Delhi.

The Authority Meeting was attended by Shri Subhasish Panda, Vice Chairman, DDA, and other members including Shri Vijender Gupta, Hon'ble MLA; Shri Somnath Bharti, Hon'ble MLA; Shri O.P. Sharma, Hon'ble MLA, and Shri Dilip Kumar Pandey, Hon'ble MLA.

DETAILS OF THE MAJOR DECISIONS TAKEN ARE:

Budget Estimates 2023-24: The Authority approved the annual budget for 2023-24, with an annual outlay of Rs. 7643 crore and receipts projected at Rs. 8541 crores.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE BUDGET:

• Civic Infrastructure

A total allocation of Rs. 3314 crore has been made for development of land, physical infrastructure and maintenance of existing infrastructure that includes roads, sewage, water supply, power lines, and drainage in development areas falling under the jurisdiction of DDA. These areas are primarily in Narela, Dwarka, and Rohini. DDA has also planned for extensive development of Yamuna riverfront. Details in r/o some specific projects are as follows:

- DDA approves Budget with focus on Civic Infrastructure, Rejuvenation of Yamuna Floodplains, and Development of Green Spaces in the Capital - LG Shri V.K. Saxena calls for concrete visible implementation in a time-bound manner.
- DDA committed to In-Site Rehabilitation of slum dwellers - special provision in BE 2023-24 for this purpose - Lt. Governor
- Special emphasis on 3rd Ring Road (UER-II) for Delhi and development of Narela, Dwarka, & Rohini
- Provisions for Sports Complexes in Rohini and Narela - Golf Course to come up in Dwarka
- Authority also approves change of land use for RRTS installations in Jungpura - transit camp for CRPF to come up at Bawana.
- DDA to transfer 219 sq.mtr land to L&DO for amalgamation aimed at redevelopment of AIIMS

Construction of Urban Extension Road-II (UER-II) as the 3rd Ring Road of Delhi is in progress through NHAI. For this project, Rs. 3600 crore will be funded by DDA out of the total project cost of Rs. 6421 crore (for Delhi portion). This project will have a great impact on decongestion of Delhi and thereby reducing vehicular pollution. It will also serve the land pooling areas of Delhi, apart from being an arterial connectivity to Rohini and Narela. It will also allow traffic moving between Gurugram and Sonapat to by-pass Central Delhi. This will also lead to faster access to the airport. It shall act as an additional Western Ring Road in Delhi, thereby decongesting the road network between Mukarba Chowk and Singhu Border.

1. DDA has planned construction of Trunk Drain of about 7.2 kms length, costing Rs. 293.21 crore to prevent water logging in DDA's developed sectors 20, 21, & 22, vacant land of undeveloped sectors 39, 40, & 41, of Rohini and adjoining 106 unauthorized colonies in Kirari assembly constituency. A provision of Rs 100 crore in BE 2023-24 has been kept for this purpose.
2. Construction of Storm Water Drain at Sector-8, Dwarka is in progress. This drain will cater to the excess discharge of rain water of the airport and prevent flooding in Dwarka Sector-8, Rajnagar, Baghdola, and Palam area. The water so discharged, shall be stored by constructing water bodies, recharge pits, and water retention bodies in the park of Sector-8 & Sector-23, Dwarka, to help recharge the depleting water levels of the area. For this purpose, a provision of Rs 30 crore has been made in BE 2023-24.
3. DDA has undertaken retrofitting and upgradation of Nehru Place and Bhikaji Cama Place Commercial Centers. The refurbishment work, including construction of multi-level car parking, is in progress. A provision of Rs. 65 crore has been made in BE-2023-24 for this purpose.

4. Construction of two foot-over bridges in Dwarka is in progress. This will provide safe passage to pedestrians. A provision of Rs. 6 crore has been kept in BE 2023-24 for this purpose.
5. DDA, with an overall outlay of Rs. 928.92 crore, has undertaken the work of rejuvenation and restoration of floodplains of the river Yamuna. The work is being taken up in a phased manner as 10 separate sub-projects. A sum of Rs. 405 crore has been provided in BE 2023-24 for this purpose.
6. The construction of iconic Bharat Vandana Park is in full swing. The park located in Sector-20, Dwarka, is spread over 189.28 acres, with a project cost of Rs. 524 crore. A provision of Rs. 105 crore has been kept in BE 2023-24 for this purpose.
7. DDA has played a key role in the overall development and management of green spaces in the city. To continue this initiative, DDA is carrying out development, upgradation, and modernization of existing as well as new parks. A provision of Rs. 61 crore has been kept in BE 2023-24 for this purpose. Apart from this, DDA is also maintaining around 787 parks. A provision of around Rs. 400 crore has been kept in BE 2023-24 for this purpose.
8. DDA has also prepared an action plan for rejuvenation of water bodies across Delhi. A provision of Rs. 55 crore has been provided in BE 2023-24 for this purpose. For irrigation and rejuvenation of water bodies and to reduce dependence on fresh water sources for watering of parks, DDA has implemented sustainable water management practice for using treated water through STP pipeline from centralized STPs and through decentralized STPs installed on nearby drains using technologies such as Constructed Wetland - Phytoid - SWAB, Zohkasou and MBBR. For this purpose, a provision of Rs. 4 crore has been kept in BE 2023-24.

9. DDA has established a network of seven biodiversity parks spread over an area of about 3000 acres in Delhi in collaboration with Centre for Environmental Management of Degraded Ecosystems (CEMDE), University of Delhi. A provision of Rs. 33 crore has been made in BE 2023-24 for the development and maintenance of these Biodiversity Parks.
10. DDA has committed Rs. 1000 crore for Phase IV of Delhi Metro. For this purpose, a provision of Rs. 350 crore has been made in BE 2023-24.
11. To contain encroachment of DDA's precious land, a provision of around Rs. 106 crore has been made towards safety/security of land in the budget estimates for 2023-24.

- **Housing:**

12. DDA has projected revenue of around Rs. 4310 crore on account of sale of additional inventory of existing housing projects which are nearing completion. It is expected that completion of UER-II connecting NH-8 to NH-2, Narela and the proposed Metro line expected to be approved by the govt. shortly, will result in value addition and will give a fillip to the demand of DDA's housing flats in Narela.
13. Emphasis in the budget has been given to complete all ongoing housing projects. Significant housing projects that will be completed in the current year includes projects in Dwarka having around 1114 HIG flats facing Dwarka Golf Course, around 650 MIG flats in Lok Nayak Puram, and around 9000 HIG/MIG flats in Narela. Flats in Lok Nayak Puram and Narela are in close proximity of UER-II where the work is in full swing.

Apart from above, construction of residential complexes on Transit Oriented Development (TOD) norms basis at karkardooma, Delhi, is currently under

progress, TOD entails bringing together metro stations, residences, workplaces, and recreational spaces. This project involves construction of 1108 MIG and 522 EWS residential flats in 1st Phase.

A total provision of Rs. 1767 crore has been kept in BE 2023-24 for construction of houses, of which 240 crore related to construction of houses at Karkardooma on TOD basis.

14. DDA is committed for In-Situ Rehabilitation of slum dwellers. RFP has been floated for 10 new projects for this purpose. 3024 EWS DU's were already completed, and Hon'ble Prime Minister handed over keys to slum dwellers in Nov 2022 in Kalkaji extension. Further, following Housing Projects under In-

Situ Rehabilitation scheme are in progress:

- Jailorwala Bagh: - 1675 EWS DU's on Design and Build model are in advance stage of construction and are likely to be completed during 2023-24.
- Kathputli Colony: - 2800 EWS DU's are being constructed on PPP model.

A provision of Rs. 70 crore has been kept in the BE 2023-24 for this purpose.

- **Sports Promotion**

15. DDA has been a premier agency for promoting sports activities in Delhi and has established a network of 15 Sports Complexes, 3 mini sports complexes and 2 Golf Courses which are presently in operation. A provision of Rs. 178 crore has been kept in the BE 2023-24 for maintenance of these complexes.
16. Further, one Sports Complex at Sector-17, Dwarka is likely to be inaugurated in the first half of 2023 and three Sports Complexes at Sector 8, 19 & 23, and one Golf Course at Sector 24, Dwarka, will also be inaugurated by the end of current year. A provision of Rs. 155 Crore has been made in BE 2023-24 for this purpose.

17. Apart from this, DDA has also undertaken development of one Integrated Multi-Sports Arena in Dwarka Sector-19B on PPP mode. Construction of two more sports complexes one each at Rohini and Narela are also proposed on PPP mode.

Change of land use of an area measuring 13.49 Ha (33.33 acres) from part 'Industrial' and part 'Utility' to 'Transportation' (T2) located at Jangpura, New Delhi: To strengthen public transport system in the national capital, the Authority has approved change of land use. National Capital Regional Transport Corporation Limited (NCRTC) had requested DDA for change of land use of an area measuring 13.49 Ha. (33.33 acres) from part 'Industrial' and part 'Utility' to 'Transportation' (T2) located at Jangpura, New Delhi for RRTS installations including stabling yard and station, operational control centre, NCRTC office and staff quarters. Now, public notice will be issued for inviting objections/suggestions.

Change of land use for 7,847.97 sq.mtr (1.94 acres) from Public & Semi-Public to "Recreational" in lieu of CLU proposal of 1.94 acres of land allotted to Ministry of Home Affairs for construction of Transit Camp for CRPF: The Authority has approved change of land use from Public & Semi Public to recreational. A request was received from CRPF for Change of Land Use (CLU) of an area measuring 1.94 acres, out of the total land at CRPF campus at Bawana. This was in lieu of approved CLU proposal of 1.94 acres of land allotted to Ministry of Home Affairs for construction of Transit Camp for CRPF in the vicinity of New Delhi Railway Station.

The proposal for CLU from PSP to Recreational is compensatory CLU. The Transit Camp is used for stay of personnel who have been urgently posted from various parts of the country and for troops to be posted for election duty in various parts of the country. Apart from this, the personnel posted in J&K, NE states and Chhattisgarh also stay here during their transfer/posting or leave.

Permission for additional activities on 2 acres out of 7 acres: To enable National Law University to expand its services and provide a wider range of facilities for its students and staff, the Authority has permitted the University to set up Technical Training Center, Community Hall, Recreational Hall, Library, among others, in 2 acres land out of 7 acres Plot to them in Dwarka.

The Integrated Complex of National Law University (NLU) is existing on 12 acres of land in Sector -14, Dwarka. Further, additional land of 7 acres adjacent to its existing campus was also allotted by DDA to NLU, Delhi for "Construction of Hostels". The land was sub-divided into two plots of area 2 acres and 5 acres each based on request of NLU to provide its students and staff with the best possible facilities and resources.

The decision was made in accordance with the Master Plan of Delhi 2021, which allows for certain additional activities to be carried out in residential use zone, subject to certain conditions.

The Authority adopted Annual Accounts of DDA for the financial year 2021-22 after certification by CAG of India. Besides, it has also approved Pre-Determined Rates for Rohini, Phase IV and V, Tikri Kalan and Narela for financial year 2022-23. Pre-Determined Rates (PDRS) are defined as the rates/price chargeable for allotment of alternative land to different categories of persons whose lands have been acquired for planned development of Delhi - low and middle income categories of persons by draw of lots and industrialist/owner/occupiers of warehouses/industries which are required to be shifted from non-conforming areas to conforming areas under the Master Plan etc.

HON'BLE LG DELHI CHAIRS UTTIPEC, APPROVES ROAD INFRASTRUCTURE & REDEVELOPMENT PLANS

The Lt. Governor of Delhi, Shri V.K. Saxena, chaired the 67th meeting of the Governing Body of Unified Traffic & Transportation Infrastructure Planning & Engineering Centre (UTTIPEC). Apart from approving the minutes of the 66th meeting and the action taken report subsequent to the last meeting held on 26th September, 2022, various far-reaching projects that will help ease the traffic situation and improve mobility, transport and transit in the city were deliberated upon and approved. In a first, the meeting also approved the logo and tagline of UTTIPEC. The tagline reads "प्रशस्त यातायात सशक्त दिल्ली".

At the outset, the Lt. Governor stressed upon the need for comprehensive prospective planning that took into account all developmental projects in any area before finalizing the proposals for approval of UTTIPEC. Shri Saxena also underlined the importance of strictly sticking to timelines and seamless inter-agency coordination.

- ◆ UTTIPEC chaired by Lt. governor approved critical road infrastructure and redevelopment plans in its 67th meeting
- ◆ Alternate road from Chhatarpur on MG Road to Goalpahari at Haryana Border cleared
- ◆ Walkability plan for Mandi house and MMI plans for Shadipur, Mayur Vihar and Peeragarhi Metro Stations approved
- ◆ LG directed officials to ensure seamless inter-agency coordination and completion of projects within fixed timelines

The decisions taken, that will go a long way in curtailing traffic jams, improving traffic flow, facilitate pedestrianization and cycling, and improve overall mobility, include:

1. Widening and upgradation of Mandi Road from Chhatarpur Metro Station on MG Road to Goalpahari on Faridabad - Gurgaon Road on Haryana Border. Spread over 9.05 kms, this existing road which has a RoW of 8 to 12 mtrs, will after this day's decision, have an expanded RoW of 30 mtrs. To be funded by the Ministry of Housing & Urban Affairs (MoHUA), GoI, and executed by the PWD, GNCTD, this projects was first approved by the UTTIPEC in its 43rd meeting in May, 2013.

The Lt. Governor was informed that due to various reasons, that included complications around the alignments and land acquisition, the earlier envisaged project has not taken off till now. Shri Saxena took grave objection to this delay and expressed surprise over the fact that a project as critical as this for the city's, as indeed the NCR's mobility plan, was kept in abeyance for so long. He issued directions to the PWD to prepare a concrete timeline for the execution of the project and issued strict instructions to ensure that the timelines projected by the PWD are met. Shri Saxena underlined that this project had the potential of solving long pending mobility and traffic woes of the capital, especially in the South Delhi area beyond Outer Ring Road.

2. Walkability plan of the area surrounding the Mandi House and Mandi House Metro Station, comprising radials such as Barakhamba Road, Tansen Marg, Safdar Hashmi Marg, Sikandra Road, Bhagwan Das Road, Copernicus Marg, and Feroz

Shah Road, was also approved. It will ease pedestrian and traffic circulation around institutions such as National School of Drama, Modern School, Lady Erwin College, Mandir House, Lalit Kala Academy, and Embassy of Nepal, apart from serving areas like the Bengali Market, Hamdard Nagar, and Todarmal Road. It will also be integrated with the Mandir House Metro interchange, Tilak Bridge Railway Station, and HRTC Bus Stand.

3. Multi-Modal Integration Plans of Shadipur Metro Station, Peeragarhi Metro Station and Mayur Vihar Extension Metro Stations, incorporating interconnected street network, street design, signalized and grade separated street crossings, model interchange locations, and parking for cycles, buses, auto rickshaws and private cars, etc., on street parking, public toilets, lighting, hawker zones, signages and street maps, and public transport to ensure last mile connectivity were also approved.

HON'BLE LG DELHI LAUNCHES PLANTATION DRIVE



On the occasion of International Day of Forests, Lt. Governor, Shri V.K. Saxena along with Union Minister for Environment, Forests & Climate Change, Shri Bhupender Yadav, launched the plantation drive for restoration of the Yamuna floodplains on the 11 km stretch between Bela Farms - Shastri Park - Garhi Mandu, from Garhi Mandu in North East Delhi. Area MP, Shri Manoj Tiwari and local MLA, Shri Ajay Mahawar were also present on the occasion.

About 10,000 children from schools, colleges and universities, and common residents of the city participated in the plantation program. The LG and the Union Environment Minister, along with children, planted 5000 saplings.

A triple grid plant cover consisting of riverine grasses in the first layer, immediately on the banks of the river, a second layer of bamboo trees, and the third layer of flowering trees will be developed on this, till now neglected, barren and depleted Eastern Bank of the Yamuna, which had turned into a dump yard of waste.

More than 4 lakh saplings of riverine grasses including Kaas, Moonj, and Vertiver, 70,000 bamboo saplings and 13,500 saplings of flowering plants including Gulmohar, Takoma, Amaltas, Dhak, and Semal, will adorn this stretch of the Yamuna Bank, in the process helping restore the floodplains and rejuvenate the Yamuna through a sustainable and aesthetically appealing natural ecosystem.



Addressing the people present there, the Lt. Governor said that, following the National Green Tribunal order in January, work on rejuvenation of the Yamuna was going on in Mission Mode and going by the results that are visible in terms of cleaning of Najafgarh Drain, cleaning of Kudsia Ghat, and development of the floodplains at Asita East, Asita West, and Baansera, one could expect 'good results' very soon.

Shri Saxena further said that all departments and civic agencies of Delhi were working as a team to clean the Yamuna, which has turned into a polluted drain due to neglect and isolated efforts by agencies during the last 30 years. He further informed that all efforts towards rejuvenation of the river were getting active support of the people and children of Delhi. Recalling the Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi's dictum of seamless governance through active people's participation, the Lt. Governor said that the works of cleaning the Yamuna were now being undertaken as per the vision of the Prime Minister.

"Our PM says that no work can be done without public participation and I am happy to state that we have received immense cooperation from the people of Delhi in this drive," he said.

This massive and a first of its kind restoration and rejuvenation of the 11-km stretch of Yamuna floodplains undertaken will not only rehabilitate the degraded soil and recharge the groundwater, but also significantly improve the aesthetics of the area while maintaining the ecological character of the Yamuna floodplains. Physical cleaning of the banks / floodplains by way of removing garbage, dumped C&D waste, animal waste and encroachments was undertaken following the inspection of Lt. Governor VK Saxena on 11th March 2023.

DDA has chalked out an extensive plantation exercise that involves a triple grid layered design wherein the first layer of the grid will have riverine grasses, the second layer will have bamboo plantations and in the third layer various flowering and fruit bearing trees/plants will be planted. In the first phase, plantation will be



carried out over 4.50 lakh sq meter of land that includes bamboo plantation over 2 lakh sq meter of land, riverine grasses over 70,000 sq meter and flowering trees over 1.80 lakh sq meter of land.

As part of the restoration and rejuvenation works, a variety of 13,371 flowering / ornamental trees like Gulmohar (548 nos.), Amaltas (5524 nos.), Legerstroemia (1279 nos.), Erythrina (2469 nos.), Takoma (640 nos), Jakaranda (877 nos.), Dhak (407 nos.) and Semal (1626 nos.) will be planted. These trees growing up to the height of 15 to 25 meters, will be helpful in increasing the green cover and enhancing the aesthetics of the floodplains.

Similarly, three species of bamboo - Bambusa Nutans (32,691 nos.), Bambus Tulda (19,228 nos.) and Dendrocalamus (18,321 nos.) - are being planted on this stretch. Bamboos are known for high water retention and soil conservation besides emitting 30% more oxygen than other plants/trees and thus improving the air quality. While

Bambusa Nutans is essentially an ornamental species; the other two species - Bambus Tulda and Dendrocalamus are extensively used as raw material in cottage industries.

Riverine grasses are extremely critical for restoration of the flood plains. DDA, like Asita East, will be planting three species of riverine grasses - Kaas (1,38,075 nos.), Moonj (1,39,604 nos.) and Vertiver (1,29,796 nos.) - at this stretch. Vertiver grass is extremely useful in recharging ground water, reducing siltation of drainage systems and water bodies and for remediation of degraded and polluted soil. Vertiver grass can tolerate extremely high levels of heavy metals and is also regarded as a low-cost technology for soil and water conservation. Similarly, Moonj grass is a perennial grass species and once planted, the roots of the plant do not die for about 24-30 years after spreading. Moonj grass works to prevent soil erosion.

The rejuvenation of the floodplains is being done through the universal principles of ecological restoration by restoring the natural depressions, creating the catchment zones, reviving the floodplain forests and grasslands and creating favourable habitats especially for water and terrestrial birds. Cleaning / desilting, restoration, and maintenance of the two main water bodies will also be done by DDA on the banks, with the aim of ultimately inter-connecting all the water bodies at different locations through a channel. This inter-connectivity will ensure uniform water levels in all the water bodies.

Once rejuvenated by DDA, this site will develop as a one of its kind public green in the locality, which has been suffering the most due to unplanned urbanization and degradation. The area adjoins localities like Seelampur, Shastri Park and Shahdara etc.

The plantation programme was organized early at 08:00 AM, so as to ensure that all attending it could get back to work on time.
