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DDA Authority Meeting

Delhi Development Authority held its meeting on 13.04.2021 through video conferencing under the chairmanship of Shri Anil Baijal, Hon'ble Lt. Governor, Delhi/Chairman, DDA attended by Shri Anurag Jain, IAS, Vice Chairman, DDA and other members of the Authority.

Following major decisions were taken:

Master Plan for Delhi 2041: The Authority has given preliminary approval for draft Master Plan for Delhi 2041. The draft will now be placed in public domain for inviting objections/suggestions from the public.

Master Plan for Delhi prepared by Delhi Development Authority is a statutory document that facilitates Delhi's development by assessing the present condition and guiding how to achieve the desired development. Implementation of the Master Plan is the collective responsibility of all agencies involved in the development of Delhi, including the concerned ministries/departments of Government of India and concerned ministries/departments of the Government of the NCT of Delhi, service providers, landowning agencies, regulators, and local bodies among others.

The first Master Plan for Delhi was promulgated in 1962 under the Delhi Development Act 1957, followed by the Master Plans of 2001 and 2021, each of which is an extensive modification of the respective previous plan document. These plans were prepared for the 20 years' perspective periods and provided a holistic framework for planned development of Delhi. The Draft MPD-2041 is also an extensive modification of the

previous plans. However, this plan is positioned as a 'strategic' and 'enabling' framework to guide the future growth of the city, built upon the lessons learnt from the implementation of the previous plans and based on learnings from across the country with respect to implementation of various projects and schemes.

Draft Master Plan for Delhi-2041 (MPD-2041) has been divided into 2 Volumes, 9 Sections which contain 22 chapters. Vision for MPD-2041 is *"Foster a Sustainable, Liveable and Vibrant Delhi by 2041"*.

Structure of MPD 2041 document

The Plan comprises of two volumes as given below:

Volume 1:

Vision 2041 and Enabling Policy Framework comprises of an introduction providing an overview of Delhi in present times, its global and regional positioning, estimates of population and projections for 2041. The Vision, Goals and Objectives of MPD-2041, along with six sections covering major policies of Environment, Economy (covers Trades & Commerce wholesale trade, industry and Government offices), Transport and Mobility, Heritage, Culture and Public Spaces, Shelter and Social Infrastructure and Physical Infrastructure are incorporated.

Volume 2:

Spatial Development Strategy and Action Plan is divided into three sections. The first section contains strategies and specific norms for guiding future spatial development of Delhi, covering both green field and brown field development in the city (land pooling, green development area, regeneration of planned and unplanned areas, transit-oriented development).

The second section provides the Plan Monitoring and Evaluation Framework for the Master Plan with key performance indicators to monitor progress including an implementation framework for facilitating periodic review and course correction.

The third section comprises of development control norms.

Salient Features of Draft Master Plan for Delhi-2041

The draft Master Plan for Delhi- 2041 is prepared based on extensive citizen and stakeholder engagement and inputs garnered which form the basis of the vision for Delhi exercise with vast outreach which includes schools, universities, RWAs, civil society groups and campaigns (related to child friendly cities, universal access, gender concerns, equity, migrants etc.), traders and market associations, environment experts, industry groups, professional bodies, etc.

Primary goals of draft Plan over next 20 years is to make Delhi an environmentally responsible, future-ready, digital city focusing on ease of living, good quality, affordable, clean and safe living environments and efficient mobility options to all, vibrant place for economic, creative & cultural hubs, attracting talent and facilitating livelihood opportunities for everyone, by also including health facilities.

The Key features of the plan are:

The Master Plan will be a more **people-friendly document**, easy-to-read and understand by the general public apart from professionals.

GIS-based plan will be developed which shall enable citizens of Delhi/ stakeholders to know the exact policies/provisions of draft Master Plan.

Development control norms related to the use of premises and activities, **flexibility** in use, parking requirements, mixing of uses, etc. have been simplified and flexibility to meet future developments and people's needs has been enabled..

Provision of good quality, **green-blue** areas for active/passive recreation and leisure.

Enhance Delhi's preparedness for climate change impacts and in **tackling pollution**.

Focus on **non-ownership/ rental and small format housing** (particularly close to mass transit) with incentivized new formats like service apartments, condominiums, hostels, student housing, worker housing, etc.

Compact and sustainable development through **TOD based projects** to bring jobs and homes closer to mass transit.

Regeneration in the old and dilapidated areas, re-densification of areas by providing incentives for planned redevelopment and/or retrofitting of areas; improve area-level safety and disaster resilience and increase availability of social infrastructure.

Improving social infrastructure in existing areas, particularly dense areas like urban villages and unauthorized colonies.

Flexibility in FAR loading and **vertical mixing of uses** to create innovative layouts that meet people's needs.

Introduction of **Special Green Economic** Uses having low FAR and larger green areas, which can provide a good environmental buffer for the city.

Special provisions for preservation and redevelopment within identified heritage and cultural precincts – focus on enhancement of cultural capital.

Mainstreaming urban design ideas such as active frontage, walkable block lengths, as a round-the-clock activity etc., ensuring convenience and safety of users.

Simplification of norms related to use premises and activities, flexibility in FAR use, parking requirements, mixing of uses, etc.

Augmentation of Physical infrastructure promoting reuse of treated waste water for horticulture, irrigation etc., mandatory provision of dual piping system, green credits as part of incentivized development, minimizing additional stress on water resources with optimal utilization of available water supply.

Enhancement of environment

Solid Waste Plant: To help in maintaining sanitation needs for the citizen by means of efficient waste management, the Authority has given final approval for change of land use from Recreational to Utility (U4) of 10.99 acres area for establishment of Solid Waste Management Facilities (for processing of C&D Waste) at Tehkhand Zone F. The approval shall now be forwarded to the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs for its consideration and final notification.

The proposal was preliminary approved by the Authority in its meeting held on 10.02.2021. Accordingly, a public notice was issued on 05.03.2021 for inviting objections/suggestions under Section 11A of DD Act. After completion of the due process, it was put up within the Authority. Land shall be allotted to South Delhi Municipal Corporation after

final notification. Further, 46.2 acres of land which is presently being utilised for sanitary land fill to be handed back to DDA on its closure.

Sewage Treatment Plants: To facilitate construction of decentralised Sewage Treatment Plants incorporating new technologies so that untreated sewage is prevented from going directly into the drains, the proposal to incorporate provision of Sewage Treatment Plants, which will include sewage pumping station and effluent pumping station has been approved. The approval shall now be forwarded to the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs for its consideration and final notification. It will promote zero waste facilities. A committee, comprising chief engineers of DDA, Delhi Jal Board along with DDA's Planning Department, was constituted to review the existing norms. The committee considered the report of consortium of professors of 7 Indian Institute of Technology while working out the requirement of land for construction of Sewage Pumping Station (SPS) and Effluent Pumping Station (EPS).

The proposal was initially approved by the Authority in its meeting held on 12.01.2021, and a public notice was issued on 29.01.2021 for inviting objections/suggestions under Section 11A of DD Act. After completion of the due process, it was put up within the Authority.

Laying foundation for a better tomorrow

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Hardeep Singh Puri, Hon'ble Union Minister MoHUA inaugurates flyover cum ROB at Narela

In sync with a plan to decongest Delhi and put special emphasis on the development of Narela, Shri Hardeep Singh Puri, Hon'ble Union Minister of State for Housing and Urban Affairs (Independent Charge) virtually inaugurated Flyover cum ROB at Narela. Shri Anil Bajjal, Hon'ble Lt Governor, Delhi; Shri Hans Raj Hans, Hon'ble Member of Parliament, North West Delhi; Shri Durga Shanker Mishra, Secretary, MoHUA and Shri Anurag Jain, Vice Chairman, DDA, also graced the occasion.



The ROB will provide smooth connectivity between the densely populated Narela and Bawana, which are upcoming residential as well as industrial hubs in North-West Delhi. There used to be traffic congestion in the area as a railway crossing located created a bottleneck on the route. Over 150 trains pass through this busy crossing every day, leaving very little time for opening of the gate. About 80,000 car users use this crossing daily, making it one of the busiest railway crossings. The length of straight portion of the ROB is 1680 metres and is built at a cost of Rs 389 crore. The project is funded by Urban Development Fund (UDF) of Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs, Govt. of India, with 80 per cent share of UDF and 20 per cent share of DDA.



Narela is a priority area for development and DDA is committed to develop it on the lines of Dwarka. In DDA's annual budget 2021-22, a significant component of the expenditure was earmarked for Narela Sub-City Development.

Allocations were made for transport infrastructure projects such as grant to DMRC towards construction of Phase -IV metro line for Rithala-Bawana-Narela corridor and construction of UER –II stretch in Delhi through NHA. Besides, DDA is undertaking various residential projects in Narela.



Some of the salient features of the ROB at Narela:

- A Road Over Bridge cum Fly Over has been constructed by DDA at Narela on Urban Extension Road -1, around 2.5 km from the NH-44, connecting NH-44 (GT Karnal Road) and Bawana-Auchandi Road.

A stretch of 10.6 km length of UER-I from NH-44 to Auchandi has been completed. UER-1 is planned to ultimately connect up to NH-8. In order to improve capacity of this corridor, it is further proposed to make the UER-1 signal free from NH-44 to Western Yamuna Canal by the introduction of U-turns at strategically planned locations.



The Road Over Bridge has provision for two separate carriage ways of 25.5 m each, consisting of 3 lane carriage way, dedicated bus lane, cycle track, utility corridor and footpath with patterned colour concrete.

- The bridge has been constructed with RCC piers, pre-stressed girders, RCC slabs in 735 m length and 945 m long RE walls in approaches.
- Around 200 octagonal poles with energy-saving LED lights illuminate the bridge uniformly in the night.
- Indication boards on Overhead Gantries at both the approaches as well as side boards along the bridge have been provided to guide commuters.





Arrangements have been made for proper drainage and harvesting of Rainwater from the ROB through Rainwater Harvesting Structure.

Prior online appointment mandatory for public hearing

It has been decided that general public can visit DDA Vikas Sadan only through prior online appointment from Directors of all departments and Dy.Directors of Land Disposal and Housing Departments during public hearing hours (Monday & Thursday; 2:30PM to 4:30PM) w.e.f. 15.04.2021. For ease of general public online appointment system has been developed and made operational. Link and steps for booking of online appointment is available on DDA website under Online Public Service section.

For appointment with officers of the rank of Commissioners and above, the existing practice of prior online appointment will continue to be in place.



66th Special Task Force Meeting

The 66th meeting of STF was held on 16.04.2021 wherein officers from all the local bodies and other concerned agencies were present. The progress of the complaints received up to 31.03.2021 was reviewed.

In total 80474 complaints have been received in STF till 31.03.2021 and action on 76563 complaints has been initiated. 1666 ATR were received during the period from 16.03.2021 to 31.03.2021. Since the constitution of STF in 2018, more than 3598 unauthorised constructions have been demolished and more than 2399 properties have been sealed. There is a pendency of 3911.

Chairman, STF directed the ULBs to take the matter seriously and expedite the action on the pending cases.
