March 5: Yoga Session

Moving on to its finale week of celebrating 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav', Delhi Development Authority organized a yoga session with an aim to rejuvenate the physical, mental and spiritual well-being of the participants at the Golden Jubilee Park Asita West near Old Railway Bridge on March 5, 2022. This event was planned to revive the ancient connection of the river with its people by bringing more and more people closer to nature.

First mentioned in the Rig Veda, 'yoga' originated in India about 5000 years ago and was later adapted by the world in various different ways. It is an ancient exercise aimed at improving strength, balance and flexibility of body, mind and soul. The practice is extremely beneficial for People of different age groups.

The session was assisted by Expert Yoga Practitioner Ms. Suman Bansal from Yog Mangalam, with the motto apostrophe between Sarve to be closer, which means "May everyone be happy" that everyone, every animal, every person and every atom, every energy should be happy and free from suffering. Saturday morning, witnessed over 150 participants for the yoga session amidst the serenity of River Yamuna floodplains. A perfect setting for practicing yoga for awakening one's physical and mental strength!

As has also been said 'A healthy body leads to a healthy mind.'

A total of 20 asanas including trikonasana, parvatasana, tadasana, kati chakrasana, gomukhasana etc., 04 types of pranayaams were performed and surya namaskar with the instructor sharing with the participants that performing 12 sets of this by a healthy person does not require any other physical exercise.

After the group session, Sonu Ram of DDA, who has represented India and won many medals for Yoga on national and international levels performed advanced asanas like shirshasana, vrischikasana, halasana, mayurasana.

The closing event of this grand celebration by DDA 'Avartan Rally'- cycling in and around the floodplains of River Yamuna, along Raj Ghat and other memorials of national importance took place the following day with the starting point of the rally being where the Yoga programme was held.



March 6: Cycling

A series of six events were organized themed around 'Rejuvenation of River Yamuna Floodplains' that brought together people from different sections of the society including students from schools and colleges, NGO's, nature enthusiasts, Yogsadhaks and cyclists groups.

Following events were organized over a period of three consecutive weekends:

- Azadi Darshan - a sand art event-cum-workshop
- Nature walk - along with spotting of flora and fauna with Delhi Bird Foundation
- Jagrukta Abhiyan - an awareness programme on role of biodiversity parks and impact of climate change
- Swachhta Abhiyan - a cleanliness drive at Qudsia Ghat
- Yogabhyas - a yoga session for rejuvenation of body, mind and soul
- Avartan Rally - cycling in and around the floodplains of River Yamuna

The sixth and the concluding event 'Avartan Rally' hosted by DDA on Sunday, 6th March 2022, saw huge participation by cyclists from V4A Cycling and Running Club, Riverside Running and Cycling Club, Cyclopaths, Let's C cycling groups and DDA officers. An approximately 9 km long cycle route was chosen to give an opportunity to the cyclists to cycle amidst the restored floodplains different from the urban greens and along Raj Ghat and other memorials of national importance. The event turned out to be a great success as it saw a participation from 80-100 cyclists who enjoyed cycling on an off-road sites amongst natural surroundings.

The site for cycling - 'Asita West' is one of the 10 projects of the Restoration and Rejuvenation Project by DDA and also the first ones to be taken up for restoration.

Located on the western bank, it derived its name from 'Asita' which is another name for River Yamuna in ancient texts and literature which also means 'the start'. Prior to the restoration works, the site was being utilized for agriculture and other unauthorized activities. The floodplains were repossessed from the encroachers, existing depressions were restored and developed into catchment water bodies that hold an approximate volume of 50,000 cubic metres of water and there are more that are in the process of being restored.



Plantation native to the floodplains has been planted all around the floodplains. A green buffer up to 300 mts. wide along the river edge has been planted with grasses of riverine nature.

Delhi Development Authority has been working on the rejuvenation and restoration of the floodplains since some years now, planning these events in the Yamuna floodplains was an initial step towards reviving the ancient connection of the river with its people. This was a great way of giving back to the community by encouraging them to come and take part in these nature oriented activities near the river. The participants were given seeds collected from native trees from DDA parks as a token gift.

Just like a combined freedom struggle brought together an Independent India, similarly DDA could celebrate 75 years of Independence due to the cooperation and participation from students from schools and NGO's, Sand artist Mr. Manas Kumar Sahoo and Team, Delhi Bird Foundation, CEMDE (Delhi University), North MCD, Yog Manglam, various cycling groups, Indraprastha Apollo Hospitals and NGO Foundation for Poverty Alleviation.



March 28: Debate Competition

DDA observes Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav to celebrate and commemorate 75 years of country's Independence and glorious history of its people, culture and achievements. MAJOR DECISIONS TAKEN AT AUTHORITY MEETING

Delhi Development Authority held its meeting on 11.03.2022 through video conferencing under the chairmanship of Shri Anil Bajjal, Hon'ble Lt. Governor, Delhi/Chairman, DDA attended by Shri Manish Kumar Gupta, IAS, Vice Chairman, DDA, and other members of the Authority including Shri Vijender Gupta MLA, Shri Somnath Bharti MLA and Shri O P Sharma MLA.

Following major decisions were taken:

Amendment in DDA (Management and Disposal of Housing Estate) Regulations, 1968: To attract more buyers, the Authority has approved amendment in DDA housing regulations to allow public to participate in DDA housing schemes if they or their family members don't own a flat/plot of area above 67sqm in Delhi. Regulation 7 prescribes that only those persons will be eligible for allotment of DDA flats who or their family members don't own a flat or land in Delhi. It has been restricting the demand for DDA flat to a considerable extent.

Besides, number of waitlisted allottees will be equal to the number of flats offered under the scheme as against 25% as per the existing Regulation. The unsold flats of \developing areas may be offered through First Come First Serve Basis and no condition in terms of ownership of flats shall apply to the applicants. In other words, unsold flats can be purchased by an applicant even though he/she may be having a flat or plot in Delhi.

Public Entities (Central/State Government Departments/Organizations) will also be eligible for allotment of such unsold flats. The approval will be sent by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs for approval and notification of the proposed amendments.

Redevelopment plan of 79.73 Ha., comprising of 5 land parcels already under possession of All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), New Delhi for development of World Class Medical University and Change of Land use of 1.69 Ha of land from Recreational (City park/District Park/Community park) to Public & Semi-Public (PS1- Education and Research University).

for AIIMS falling in Planning Zone- 'F': To further strengthen healthcare facilities in the national capital, the authority today approved the proposal to facilitate the Redevelopment of AIIMS campus in an area of 79.73 Ha as a "World Class Medical University". All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi (AIIMS) which is country's premiere medical institution, has embarked on a redevelopment mission to further enhance and augment its facilities. The redevelopment project envisages upgradation of the entire campus and its facilities to bring it at par with the International Standards. The vision for redevelopment is to create a smart and sustainable campus which meets all present and future requirements of healthcare, education, and research. The campus master plan will include a new hospital for 3000 beds, a new academic and research buildings for multiple graduate and postgraduate programmes and new hostel blocks.

The following was approved:

- Designation of the whole campus as 'Education & Research University' as per Master Plan of Delhi 2021 and assigning of unified Development Controls norms to the campus.
- Modification in the Zonal Plan of Zone 'F' prepared under MPD-2021 for earmarking the campus's area for Redevelopment. Accordingly, Public Notice will be issued for inviting objections/suggestion from general public under section 11A of Delhi Development Act 1957 for this redevelopment.

Change of Land use of 1.69 Ha. land parcel in West Ansari Nagar campus from 'Recreational' (City park/District Park/Community park) to 'Public and Semi Public facilities'- PS1 (Education and Research university) was approved. Accordingly, Public Notice will be issued for inviting objections/suggestion from general public under section 11A of Delhi Development Act 1957.

Change of Land Use for setting up E-Waste Management (Ecopark) : For proper management of e-waste, the Authority has approved change of Land Use for land measuring 8.50 Ha. (21 acres) from Residential-RD to Utility-U4 for setting up E-Waste Management (Ecopark) at Village Holambi Kalan, Zone P-I (Narela Sub-city), Delhi.

Now, Public Notice will be issued for inviting objections/suggestion from general public under section 11A of Delhi Development Act 1957 for this redevelopment. The purpose of setting up E-Waste management (Ecopark) is E-Waste management in Delhi through formal recycling, ensuring that all Waste Electronic and Electrical equipment (WEEE) is collected, stored, dismantled and recycled in an environmentally sound manner.

The proposal started with the intervention of the Principal Scientific Advisor to the Government of India to formalize the E-Waste management in Delhi.

As per the Master Plan of Delhi 2021 and notified Zonal Development Plan of Zone P-I, the Land Use of area under reference is Residential-RD and will require Change of Land Use in the Master Plan of Delhi 2021 and notified Zonal Development Plan of Zone P-I from Residential-RD to Utility U4 as per the provisions under Section 11(A) of Delhi Development Act, 1957.

This proposal aims to create a win-win situation by integration of activities in the formal and informal sectors engaged in E-Waste management in Delhi. Information sector have attractive advantages in handling E-Waste, particularly their strong presence, high collection rates, high recovery rates, convenience to consumers time saving, reduced cost, etc. The activities in the park will target small and medium scale enterprises (SMEs) clusters involved in E-Waste recycling. This will be first of its kind in Delhi. A request from Special Secretary (Environment), GNCTD was received for identification and allotment of land for setting up of Ecopark in Delhi for management of E-waste by GNCTD.

Change of Land Use at Vasant Vihar, New for Establishment of Headquarters for National Disaster Response Force (NDRF): The Authority has approved Change of Land Use of 0.6769 Ha (6769.60 sqm) of land at Vasant Vihar, New Delhi from Residential to Government (G2) allotted for Establishment of Headquarters for National Disaster Response Force (NDRF).

NDRF is a creation of Disaster Management Act-2005. As of now, this force has no permanent office space for establishment of its Headquarters. Due to non-availability of proper office space, it is very difficult to install National Emergency Communication Plan (NECP) at HQ NDRF. Hence, to overcome this issue establishment of HQ DG NDRF at New Delhi is essential need of time.

Establishment of HQ DG NDRF at National capital Delhi is important, from operational point of view, to reduce response time & to coordinate with other Govt. Departments and stake holders. A Public Notice will be issued for inviting objections/suggestion from general public under section 11A of Delhi Development Act 1957.

CHAIRMAN STF REVIEWS PROGRESS AT 82nd & 83rd STF MEETING

82nd STF Meeting

The 82nd meeting of STF was held on 11.03.2022 wherein officers from all the local bodies and other concerned agencies were present. The progress of the complaints received up to 28th February 2022 was reviewed.

In total 1,24,534 complaints have been received in STF till 28th February 2022 and action on 1,18,318 complaints have been initiated. 2708 ATR were received during the period from 16.02.2022 to 28.02.2022.

Since the constitution of STF in 2018, more than 4200 unauthorised constructions have been demolished and more than 2600 properties have been sealed. Chairman, STF directed the ULBs to take the matter of pendency seriously and expedite the action on the pending cases.

Encroachment removal action was taken by SDMC at areas including J-Block Saket, PVR Saket, Firni Road both sides, Pramod Mahajan Road on 17.02.2022, E-Block Market Hauz Khas, Sudershan Road, Gautam Nagar Nallah, Sohan Lal Market, Masjid Moth Uday Park on 21.02.2022, IGNOU Road Saidulajab, MB Road, Saket Metro Station on 24.02.2022, Parmod Mahajan Marg, J-Block Saket, PVR Saket, Max. Hospital Saket, Press Enclave Road on 28.02.2022.

Encroachment removal action was taken by NDMC at areas including Connaught Place, Palika Bazar, Gole Market, Regal, Revoli, Janpath, Shanker Market, Sarojini Nagar, Safdarjung, VVIP, Khan Market, Khanna Market and Chanakyapuri.

83rd STF Meeting

The 83rd meeting of STF was held on 25.03.2022 where in officers from all the local bodies and other concerned agencies were present. The progress of the complaints received up to 15th March 2022 was reviewed.

In total 1,28,079 complaints have been received in STF till 15th March 2022 and action on 1,20,736 complaints have been initiated. 2418 ATR were received during the period from 01.03.2022 to 15.03.2022.

Since the constitution of STF in 2018, more than 4200 unauthorised constructions have been demolished and more than 2600 properties have been sealed. Chairman, STF directed the ULBs to take the matter of pendency seriously and expedite the action on the pending cases.

Encroachment removal action was taken by SDMC at areas including Lado Sarai Village, CNG Station, MB Road and Pramod Mahajan Marg on 02.03.2022, Main Gate Chowk Shahpur Jat Village, Asian Games Village Road and Shahpur Jat Village on 04.03.2022, Shani Mandir, Near Barat Ghar, Madangir Village, Balmiki Marg and Pushpa Bhawan on 07.03.2022, Indira Market Sector-7 RK Puram, Prem Nath Dogra Marg, Tamil Sangam Marg and Mohan Singh Market RK Puram on 10.03.2022, E-Block Market, A-Block Market and Vasant Vihar on 14.03.2022.

Encroachment removal action was taken by NDMC at areas including Connaught Place, Palika Bazar, Gole Market, Janpath, Shanker Market, Sarojini Nagar, Safdarjung, Kidwai Nagar, VVIP, Khan Market and Khanna Market.

Number of properties sealed/de-sealed by the ULBs/Govt. agencies from the inception of STF (inclusive of Monitoring Committee) up to 28.02.2022.

Chairman, STF reiterated that close co-ordinated efforts needs to be continued by the ULBs & Govt. Agencies to take actions for removal of encroachment in accordance with the law. Police Deptt. assured that all support shall be provided to remove the encroachment from roads and take action on unauthorized construction effectively.

DDA SIGNS MoU WITH CSIR-NBRI FOR HORTICULTURE SCHEME

Delhi Development Authority signed an Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with CSIR National Botanical Research Institute to achieve the Horticulture works at Amrut Biodiversity Park, 108 Hectares area. NBRI will be replicating the journey of independent India through its Horticulture scheme.



DEVELOPMENT OF WEB BASED PORTAL TO DISPLAY THE LAYOUT PLANS OF DELHI

Government of India under the Ease of Doing Business (EoDB) has initiated to get all the layout plans of Delhi digitized and developed a web-portal where approved layout plans are uploaded. The work has assigned to DDA by Ministry of housing and Urban Affairs. DDA got all the layout plans collected from the 17 Planning Zones of Delhi for an area of 1483 sq. km. These layouts are 40-70 years old. The latest approved layouts were identified, scanned and digitized for which a consultancy firm was awarded the work. For better understanding of general public these layout plans have been digitized which were available with various Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) i.e. all MCDs, NDMC, DDA, GNCTD, DSIIDC, L&DO, etc.

The quality of these layouts was not legible, so the scanned layouts were vectorised and stitched together Zone wise and the Zones were overlaid on the Master Plan of Delhi. The Graphic User Interface (GUI) of the web-portal displays various features and tools to facilitate viewing and downloading of the Layout Plans (LoPs) of various Urban Local Bodies (ULBs). General public can view / download the Layout Plans (LoPs) already approved by the concerned Urban Local Body(ULBs) and authorities. This information can be used by public for various purposes.

The portal was inaugurated by Vice Chairman, DDA on 7th March 2022 and has been made live for viewing by general public.





AMIT LUTHRA WINS 22ND LT. GOVERNOR'S GOLF CUP TOURNAMENT 2022

Amit Luthra won the 22nd DDA Lt. Governor's Golf Tournament 2022 which concluded at Qutab Golf Course. Ranveer Mitroo was the runner-up. However, as a mark of appreciation and encouragement, Shri Luthra handed over his prize to Master Mitroo, who is a teenager. In the ladies category, Sonavi Kakkar was the Winner, Himadri Singh was the runner-up. Speaking on the occasion, Shri Anil Baijal, Hon'ble Lt. Governor, Delhi complemented DDA for organising the event successfully. He said people should be encouraged for undertaking sports and physical exercise, while congratulating all the winners and participants.

The tournament is an annual event instituted in 2001. The 22nd Lt. Governor's Cup Golf Tournament has been held on 5th, 6th, 12th and 13th March 2022. This is the largest golf Tournament in the Country in terms of number of participants. A total of around 850 entries were received for the event. Qutab Golf Course, the first public golf course of the country, has become increasingly popular with golfers and on some days there are more than 400 players on the course.



DDA has developed 15 sports complexes, 3 mini sports complexes and 2 golf courses. 5 Centres of Excellence in various Olympic disciplines are under construction in Dwarka and Rohini. A championship level golf course with yardage of more than 7300 yards is under development at Sector 24, Dwarka. The project is scheduled to be completed in 2023. Like the new golf driving range at Qutab golf course, DDA will also construct a double level range Dwarka golf course.
