LAUNCHING OF SELF ASSESSMENT SCHEME FOR THE BENEFIT OF DAMAGE PROPERTY ASSESSEES

A DDA has launched a Self Assessment Scheme on its portal for the benefit of all damage property assesseees of 23 Nazul Estates. Public can access the portal through "<https://www.dda.org.in>". The list of 23 Nazul Estates is given as follows:

B Damage properties are those properties which have been existing on Govt. Land placed at the disposal of the erstwhile Delhi Improvement Trust (DIT) through the "Nazul Agreement" of March 1937, but occupied unauthorisedly by private persons, being unauthorised occupants of Government land. Such occupants are liable to pay Damage Charges to DDA under The Public premises (Eviction of Unauthorised Occupants) Act 1958, now Public Premises (Eviction of Unauthorised Occupants) Act 1971.

C Through this Self-Assessment Scheme, all the assesseees can fill-up the details of their properties on the said portal viz., date of payment of Damage Charges, Area and date of transfer of occupancy rights and superstructure occupied by them and can also assess the damage charges themselves through the Damage Calculator in the Portal.


D All the damage properties wherein occupancy details vary floor-wise, damage charges will be calculated during the self-assessment as per the correct use and area of the floor on the basis of prevalent rates (Rates are available in the Damage Calculator).

E There is a provision of 50% waiver of penalty (i.e. interest on arrears of Damage) in case, the assesseees make the payment within a period of 6 months from the date of notification (i.e. 11.07.2020).

F As per records, this scheme will directly benefit 22,000 damage properties. After considering partition and floor-wise division, the number of beneficiary families will go up to 50,000.

G All the damage property assesseees are requested to avail the benefits of the scheme and clear their dues to avoid any type of coercive measures by DDA.

H After identifying the true damage property assesseees through this self-assessment scheme, comprehensive scheme for regularisation of ownership of damage properties will be brought before the Authority.

DDA AUTHORITY MEETING



The Delhi Development Authority held its meeting on 14.07.2020 through video conferencing under the chairmanship of Shri. Anil Baijal, Hon'ble Lt. Governor, Delhi / Chairman, DDA which was attended by Shri. Anurag Jain, IAS, Vice Chairman, DDA and other Members of the Authority.

The Authority placed on record its appreciation for the contribution made by Hon'ble Members - Shri. Somnath Bharti, Shri. S. K. Bagga and Shri. O. P. Sharma during their tenure with DDA which ended on 11.02.2020.

The Authority welcomed Shri. Somnath Bharti, Shri. O. P. Sharma and Shri. Dilip Kumar Pandey - Hon'ble Members of Legislative Assembly NCTD who have been declared elected unopposed for representation in DDA as Authority Members.

The following important decisions were taken:

As a relief measure in view of the ongoing pandemic DDA extends time for making payment of additional FAR charges and use conversion charges for residential properties/Co-op. Group Housing Properties, on mixed use/commercial streets and commercial properties (excluding hotel and parking plots) and use conversion charges for mixed use /commercial use of premises and shop-cum-residence plots/complexes later designated as LSCs up to 31.12.2020 which was previously up to 28.06.2020.



Sale of 50% EWS flats of DDA quota in Group Housing Projects simplified to avoid double stamp duty: At present, the process of allotment of the EWS flats to the beneficiary involves levying of stamp duties at two levels i.e., one when the DE sells to DDA and other when DDA allots to the beneficiary.

The burden of the dual stamp is getting transferred to the beneficiary and in the process the cost of the flat is increased thereby defeating the sole purpose of affordable housing / housing for all. In order to streamline the process of allotment and reduce the cost of apartments, relevant clauses in MPD-21 are suitably modified to avoid double stamp duty which would now read as under:-

- 50% of DUs developed by Developer Entity (DE) will be sold to the eligible beneficiaries identified by DDA/local bodies as per DDA Policy.
- Parking is also added to the facilities which shall be provided by the DE for the separate housing pocket.



- Now the DE shall be allowed to undertake actual transfer/transaction of saleable component under its share/ownership to the prospective buyers only after the prescribed land and EWS housing component is sold / transferred to the eligible beneficiaries identified by DDA/local bodies at the rates prescribed by DDA.

The proposals above will be forwarded to MoHUA for final notification under section 57 of DD Act.

In addition to the above the Authority approved the proposal for issuance of public notices for inviting objections & suggestions regarding increase in FAR under “Warehouse / Warehousing Schemes” in MPD - 2021: Various requests from concerned local bodies were received regarding warehouses, warehousing schemes along with other related issues.

Also due to changing times and introduction of numerous online shopping sites the demand for “warehouse to home” model of business has increased the need for warehouses for various commodities.



It is proposed to increase maximum Ground Coverage for premises (Integrated Freight Complex / Wholesale Market / Warehousing Schemes) use from 30% to 40% and Maximum Floor Area Ratio (FAR) from 80% to 100%. The Additional FAR charge shall be payable as decided by the Govt. from time to time.

To incentivise in situ rehabilitation projects DDA proposes flexibility in use of land with higher FAR. The minimum residential component of the land area for rehabilitation of the squatters provided by the Policy is 60% and maximum area for remunerative use is 40%.

Now the Authority has approved proposal for issuance of public notice regarding proposed amendments/modifications which provide that the Scheme should be designed in a composite manner with an overall maximum FAR of 400 on the residential component of the land (including Facilities i.e. Facility for the level based on the population accommodated under the project/scheme).



The maximum FAR of 300 on the remunerative component of the land shall be applicable irrespective of the land use. Any use/mix of uses shall be permitted as proposed by the developer entity within the overall FAR of 300, in the remunerative component as per MPD provisions. In case the developer entity proposes mix of uses, the parking and other development control norms will be applicable on pro rata basis, on the FAR utilised for the particular use.

The proposal for change of land use of DDA land measuring 14.6 ha. located at Mukarba Chowk, from commercial to residential was approved in principle and 'influence zone plan' to be prepared prior to issuance of public notice.



PREPARATION OF THE NEXT MASTER PLAN FOR DELHI 2041

MPD-2041 TO FOCUS TOWARDS CITIZEN ENGAGEMENT



Delhi Development Authority (DDA) in collaboration with the National Institute of Urban Affairs (NIUA), is preparing the next Master Plan for Delhi - 2041. This Master Plan shall be a strategic enabling plan of which Sustainability, Inclusivity and Equity will be the underlying core principles. The policies would majorly focus towards having quality living for the citizens of Delhi and establish its potential at global economic level and cultural powerhouse.

The 12th Review Committee meeting was held on 23. 07. 2020 under the chairmanship of Shri Anurag Jain, Vice Chairman DDA to review the progress of the Master Plan for Delhi-2041, including various policies and public engagement strategy during the plan preparation.



The major focus of the meeting was towards the public engagement strategy. The plan should respond to the needs and concerns of the people of Delhi. For this purpose a comprehensive stakeholder engagement process is being carried out since the beginning of last year.

The first step was to have focussed group discussions with experts, professionals, civil society groups on specific aspects such as environment, health, pollution, heritage, mobility, renewable energy, gender issues, urban design creation of public spaces among others. In coming months, a wider outreach will be done by DDA and NIUA through newspapers in all local languages, radio, social media etc., for extensive public engagement. A public engagement calendar will be published shortly by DDA for public meetings and interactions to get the feedback of citizens, RWAs, stakeholder groups such as industry and market associations, professional bodies, civil society groups, informal sector, children and youth etc.

These meetings are planned to be held online in the months of August and September 2020, given the COVID-19 situation.

DDA has launched a new interactive microsite as the “Public Engagement Portal for MPD-2041”, which is being developed incrementally. The portal will share information on the preparation of MPD-2041 as well as a number of visioning and perception surveys for citizens’ feedback. Date and time of the public consultation meetings and events shall be shared on the portal to enable citizens of Delhi for participating in the MPD-2041 preparation process and shape a shared vision for developing the city.



48TH SPECIAL TASK FORCE MEETING



48TH SPECIAL TASK FORCE MEETING HELD ON 10.07.2020

Special Task Force was constituted by MoHUA on 25.04.2018 with an objective to comprehensively oversee effective and proper enforcement of the provisions of Master Plan, Unified Building by-laws for Delhi, ensuring compliance with the provisions of applicable Acts, Rules & Regulations and removal of encroachment and unauthorised construction.

STF has now been declared a statutory body under Section 5A & 57 of the DD Act, 1957. It comprises of a 19 member team with Vice-Chairman, DDA as its chairman and other senior officers from various Local Bodies.

Regular meetings are being held on fortnightly basis since the inception of STF. In the 47th meeting of the STF held on 26.06.2020 through video conferencing under the chairmanship of Mr. Anurag Jain IAS, the chairman emphasised that protection of land and removal of encroachments are of utmost priority and all measures need to be taken in this regard. To be more effective in future, it was unanimously decided that all the Members/Departments would work in close coordination and prioritise the pending cases for taking action. The members assured that they will review the pendency and shall start the action in right earnest of which the results will be reflected upon in the next meeting.



Removal of encroachment from land and road:

During the period from May 2018 and June 2020, all the concerned ULBs in totality have cleared approximately 400 Ha. of area under encroachment. Temporary construction on the streets have also been removed on continuous basis and 11,500 km. length of road /street/footpath have been cleared (repeated action on both sides of road on a continuous basis by ULBs). 45,000 number of vehicles and 1,50,000 number of items have been seized and 7 lakh challans have been issued.

The citizens of Delhi can lodge their complaints with the STF through various portals such as STF Web-Portal (<http://www.dda.org.in/stf/STFlogin.aspx>), Mobile App(Smart City-311), or through email.

Till date, a total of approx. 51000 complaints have been received out of which Action Taken Report (ATR) on 38000 cases have been uploaded by the concerned ULBs/Govt. Agencies. These ATRs are submitted to the Hon'ble Supreme Court every 15 days for their appraisal.

Chairman, STF directed that in case of action to be taken on the removal of encroachment and unauthorised construction pertaining to multiple agencies, the concerned agencies shall coordinate personally to fix the programme. A number of demolition programmes were scheduled in the meeting on removal of encroachment and unauthorised construction which involved joint actions by ULBs/Govt. Agencies. Police Deptt. was also directed to provide necessary police force for the implementation of the demolition programme.

During the 48th STF meeting, the ULBs/Govt. Agencies highlighted the following action following removal of encroachment:

- The action taken by EDMC on 08.07.2020 on removal of encroachment in East Delhi on the service road between Khureji Chowk and Chitra Vihar was appreciated. Likewise, the action taken by SDMC on removal of temporary encroachment from road at Subash Nagar, Sarai Julliana, Pant Nagar, Jungpura and Lajpat Nagar was also informed to Chairman, STF.
- SDMC has already carried out removal of encroachment from the road at Subash Nagar, Sarai Julliana, Pant nagar, Jungpura, Lajpat Nagar, Mehar Chand Market, Lodhi Road during 6th July to 8th July 2019 (Photographs Annexed).
- PWD has demolished the encroachment on ring road at Sarai Kale Khan and constructed the boundary wall to restrict further encroachment.

49TH SPECIAL TASK FORCE MEETING



MEETING OF STF FOCUSED ON CLEARANCE OF PENDING AND REMOVAL OF ENCROACHMENT



The 49th meeting of STF was held on 31.07.2020 wherein officers from all the local bodies and other concerned agencies were present. The progress of the complaints received up to 15th July was reviewed.

In total 52,253 complaints have been received in STF till 15th July 2020 and action on 45,955 complaints have been initiated.

While reviewing the progress on action taken on the complaints, Chairman, STF observed that there has been significant reduction in the pendency. From the last STF meeting which was held on 10.07.2020, the pendency has reduced from 12600 to 6298.

The effort taken by North DMC, SDMC and EDMC in disposal of complaints was applauded. Chairman, STF directed the ULBs and Govt. Agencies to continue with the good work.

Action of EDMC in reclaiming 54 Tot lots in Mayur Vihar, Phase 1 which were illegally occupied by ground floor residents came in for special praise.



EDMC has fenced 47 Tot lots out of 54 and work on fencing of balance Tot lots is in progress which will be completed soon. In addition, encroachments have been removed on 14 major road stretches including Shakarpur, Krishna Nagar, Gandhi Nagar main road, Mayur Vihar Phase-I etc.

Chief Engineer-HQ, North DMC informed that major demolition action has been taken on property no. T-67, Baljeet Nagar; SK-35 Sidhora Kalan; B-2/8 Sector-11, Rohini by North DMC.

Similarly, actions have been taken by SDMC. Addl. Commr., SDMC informed that major demolition work has been carried out at Pali Village and encroachment has been removed on 28 road stretches including Vasant Kunj, Munirka, R.K. Puram, Chhattarpur, Lado Sarai, HauzKhas, Kailash Colony, Green Park, Khanpur etc.

Anti-encroachment drives have also been initiated on approximately 280 km. road length by ULBS from 1st July to 15th July 2020. EDMC & SDMC have cleared 135 km. and 103 km. road stretch respectively. All the ULBs and PWD informed that temporary encroachments are being removed regularly on a continuous basis from the roads. Target for removal of encroachment from the roads were given to all ULBs and PWD.



Chairman, STF re-iterated that closely coordinated efforts need to be continued by the ULBs & Govt. Agencies to take actions for removal of encroachment in accordance with the law. Jt. CP, Traffic Police assured that all support shall be provided to remove the encroachment from roads and take action on construction effectively.
