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## DDA AUTHORITY MEETING

Delhi Development Authority held its meeting on 13.07.2021 through video conferencing under the chairmanship of Shri. Anil Baijal, Hon'ble Lt. Governor, Delhi/Chairman, DDA attended by Shri Anurag Jain, IAS, Vice Chairman, DDA and other members of the Authority including Shri Vijender Gupta MLA, Shri Somnath Bharti MLA, Shri. O.P. Sharma MLA, Shri Adesh Kumar Gupta Municipal Councillor, North Delhi Municipal Corporation and Shri Kailash Sankla, Municipal Councillor, South Delhi Municipal Corporation

### Following major decisions were taken:

#### **Inclusion of Affordable Rental Housing Complex (ARHC) Scheme in MPD 2021:**

To create vibrant, sustainable and inclusive affordable rental housing avenues for urban migrants and urban poor, the Authority has given final approval for Affordable Rental Housing Complexes (ARHCs). The proposal has been taken up in line with the Operational Guidelines for ARHC Scheme, issued by the Govt. of India.

Following the preliminary approval, in the Authority meeting held on 18.03.2021, a public notice was issued for inviting objections/suggestions. All the objections/suggestions received, were placed before the Board of Enquiry and Hearing. They will now be forwarded to the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs, Gol for its consideration and final notification.

The proposals pave the way for ARHCs on Privately Owned Land/ Land owned by Govt. Agencies/ DE appointed by Govt. Agency on priority basis. This will also include plots auctioned by DDA where developer wishes to utilize the purchased plot for ARHC.

As per the approved norms, the Housing Complex will consist of a mix of Dwelling Unit (Single bedroom/double bedroom) and Dormitory of 4/6 beds including all common facilities. A maximum overall FAR of 50% over and above the permissible FAR is also being provisioned, free of charges, to incentivize the concept of ARHCs in Delhi.

The policy provides for a maximum 10% of permissible FAR to be utilized as commercial component, which could be rented or sold by the Developer Entity. The occupancy of the ARHCs will be granted on the basis of License Deed with a minimum tenure of three months and a maximum tenure of three years, ensuring accessibility to all the eligible beneficiaries for ARHCs.

The proposed ARHCs will ensure affordable and easily accessible rental housing in the vicinity of their work places to the urban poor and migrant workers in Delhi.

**Draft Policy for Dynamic Parking Norms for Delhi:** Considering the changed scenario of transportation, the Authority has given final approval for Dynamic Parking Norms for Delhi. The parking norms have been formulated based on the study conducted by DUAC and discussions with NIUA, MCDs and tractor transportation experts. It will now be forwarded to the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs, Gol for its consideration and final notification.

In the Authority meeting held on 18.03.2021, preliminary approval was given, after that public notice was issued for inviting objections/suggestions. All the objections/suggestions received, were placed before the Board of Enquiry and Hearing.

The Policy has rationalized the parking norms of Delhi to cater to the current and future requirements of the city. Metro deductions and Multi-Level Car Parking deduction have been seen inbuilt while calculating parking requirements for various use categories. Once notified, these norms shall be applicable on the new as well as all the ongoing projects.

Presently, parking norms in Delhi are based on the designated use premise and, it has been observed that the surplus parking from buildings spills over, encroaching and congesting the public spaces. In some cases, the over provisioning has led to excessive construction of basements especially in government projects. This policy will ensure better utilization of public funds. For example, in case of Government Hospitals most of the people use public mode of travel or NMVs like cycles, rickshaws, etc. to access the facility. The basements constructed for parking remain unused and are liable to misuse. Thus, in order to provide a balance in the parking provisions, the existing norms have been revisited and revised.

The revised norms ensure that the Parking norms in case of Residential Projects shall now be based on the number and size of the Dwelling Units instead of Built-up area ensuring the residents a balanced facility. In case of Government Housing, the norms of GPRA colonies shall be adopted as approved by Gol.

In case of Banquet Halls, parking norms have been enhanced keeping in view the orders of the Hon'ble NGT.

In order to ensure that there is no anomaly while calculating the Equivalent Car Space (ECS) norms and to ensure that the norms are uniformly applicable across all categories in the Master Plan, the term Built-up / floor area wherever provided for calculating parking norm has been replaced by FAR area. This shall also align the norms as per the procedure followed for sanctioning of building plans under the ambit of UBBL – 2016.

**Change of Land Use from Recreational to Public & Semi Public Facilities for construction of Transit Camp for CRPF:** To facilitate deployment / mobilization of CRPF troops in the vicinity of New Delhi Railway Station, the Authority has given preliminary approval for change of land use of an area measuring 1.94 acre (7850.90sq.m.) from 'Recreational (District Park)' to 'Public & Semi-Public Facilities' at Bhavbhuti Marg for construction of a Transit Camp for CRPF. The proposal will now be put in public domain for inviting objections / suggestions from general public.

The Authority has also approved Plinth Area Rates (PAR) used for the calculation of construction cost of flats using the standard costing formula for financial years 2020-21 and 2021-22 for following inventory of flats:

i) Flats offered first time in DDA Housing Scheme 2021

ii) Flats offered first time in DDA Housing Scheme 2019

iii) Old inventory flats offered prior to DDA Housing Scheme 2019

Besides, revision of land rates for computation of conversion charges for commercial & industrial properties and multilevel parking seeking conversion from leasehold to freehold for the years 2019-20 to 2021-22 was also approved.

**Amendment in Procedure and Eligibility Conditions for e-auction of Religious Category plots:** Certain amendments in procedure and eligibility conditions were proposed before the Authority for allotment of Religious Category plots through e-auction. However, it was decided to form a subcommittee to examine the procedure and eligibility for e-auction of such plots, and give suggestions thereupon. Hon'ble Authority members- Shri Vijender Gupta- MLA, Shri Somnath Bharti- MLA, Shri O.P. Sharma MLA and Shri. Manish Gupta Member (Admin and Land Management) DDA are its members. Revised agenda would be brought before the next Authority meeting.

## MPD-2041: SERIES OF WEBINARS ON DRAFT MASTER PLAN FOR DELHI

### WEBINAR ON 1.07.2021

Delhi Development Authority conducted an online Webinar on Master Plan of Delhi-2041 with the citizens of Delhi on 1<sup>st</sup> July 2021 from 10.00 a.m. to 11.30 a.m. The purpose of the Webinar was to facilitate the general public to understand the plan provisions, various policies that have been made part of the Draft Master Plan-2041, placed in public domain on 9<sup>th</sup> June 2021 for inviting public suggestions and objections. This was the first online Webinar in a series of three more to be held on 6<sup>th</sup> July 2021, 17<sup>th</sup> July 2021, 20<sup>th</sup> July 2021. In the first Webinar, issues related to introduction & vision, Environment, Economy, Culture, Heritage and public space chapters were presented. A total of 195 participants attended the Webinar and the comments/suggestions provided by them have been noted by Delhi Development Authority.

The Webinar was attended by Vice-Chairman, DDA, Commissioner (Plg.) and Sr. Officers of DDA and NIUA. V.C, DDA highlighted the main objectives of the Webinar and appreciated the participants for their valuable suggestions. The major issues raised in the webinar were extension of last date for submitting objections / suggestions, lack of specific and concrete planning goals, incentives to be given for green roofs, need for tiered planning, Regional Planning and Zonal Plan, periodic and regular engagement of stakeholders, regulatory framework for permissible activities in proposed zone O-1 and UCs, basic maps, conceptual diagrams/

illustrations to be included in MPD 2041, informal sector units permitted which is very limited (table 22.21), provisions for Informal sector which is limited in draft MPD-2041, to make Baseline reports available in public domain, special provisions for marginalized groups accessing public spaces, checking unauthorized construction and encroachment on public land, status of Special Area mentioned in MPD-2021 Which needs to be clarified, minimum area for TOD to be reduced to 0.5 ha., difference between redevelopment scheme and regeneration plan Which needs to be clarified, preservation of South Delhi Aravalli ridge, rejuvenation of river Yamuna and elaboration on trade and commerce provisions required in draft MPD-2041.

The next webinar was organized on 06.07.2021 (Tuesday) and the discussion covered chapters 7 to 12: Shelter and Social Infrastructure (chapters 7, 8) Transport and Mobility (chapters 9-12) of Draft MPD-2041.

#### WEBINAR ON 06.07.2021

Delhi Development Authority conducted an online Webinar on Master Plan of Delhi-2041 with the citizens of Delhi on 6<sup>th</sup> July 2021 from 03:00 p.m. to 04:30 p.m. .The purpose of the Webinar was to facilitate the general public to understand the plan provisions, various policies that have been made part of the draft Master Plan-2041, placed in public domain on 9<sup>th</sup> June, 2021 for inviting public suggestions and objections. This was the second online Webinar in a series of four webinars held during 01<sup>st</sup> July 2021 to 20<sup>th</sup> July 2021. In this webinar, issues related to Chapter 7 to 12 i.e. Shelter & Social Infrastructure and Transport & Mobility were presented. A total of 190 participants which included general public, Sr. Officers of DDA and National Institute for Urban

Affairs (NIUA) who attended the Webinar and the comments/suggestions provided by participants were noted by Delhi Development Authority.

Senior Officer from DDA addressed the participants and introduced the main objectives of the Webinar which was followed by a presentation by NIUA explaining the various plans and policies of the draft Master Plan-2041 related to Shelter, Social Infrastructure and Transport & Mobility. The major suggestions provided during the webinar were: MPD 2041 to be GIS based plan, last mile connectivity to be focused by promoting more Intermediate Public Transport (IPT) modes, mention of homeless population in terms of their entitlements, facilities mandated for night shelters should be detailed out, women work force participation to be reflected in provisions for housing (rental/ affordable housing policy), measures for decarbonisation to be provided in the mobility sector for MPD, requirement of alternate roads to bring down the traffic load on the mainarterial roads, housing backlog need to be addressed, need for Specific guidelines for urban peripheral rural area, approach of mixed use development zones to be adopted on the lines to the TOD corridors, healthcare infrastructure to cater to the extreme pandemic situation, commercial use to be allowed in LDRA, land requirements for additional housing need to be mentioned, development of rental housing, interlinkage of MPD 2041 with sub regional plan for NCR, vertical mixed use needs to allowed everywhere in order to promote, urban extension road (UER) with metro or BRT services needs to be provided, preferable zero set back is as it enables safe streets for women & children, minimum plot sizes for redevelopment should be kept at minimum, circle rates

need to be rationalized based on incentives basis, road network needs to be part of redevelopment. The next webinar will be organized on 13.07.2021 (Tuesday) from 03:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. and the discussion will cover chapters 13 to 18 i.e. Physical Infrastructure (chapters 13-16), Spatial Development Framework (chapters 17, 18) of Draft MPD-2041.

#### WEBINAR ON 13.07.2021

Delhi Development Authority conducted an online Webinar on Master Plan of Delhi-2041 with the citizens of Delhi on 13<sup>th</sup> July 2021 from 03:00 pm to 04:30 pm. The purpose of the Webinar was to facilitate the general public to understand the plan provisions, various policies that have been made part of the draft Master Plan-2041, placed in public domain on 9<sup>th</sup> June, 2021 for inviting public suggestions and objections. This was the third online Webinar in a series of four webinars started on 01<sup>st</sup> July 2021. In this third webinar, issues related to Chapters 13 to 18 of draft Master Plan for Delhi-2041 i.e. Physical Infrastructure (Chapters 13-16) & Spatial Development Framework (Chapters 17, 18) was presented. A total of 114 participants which included general public, Sr. Officers of DDA and NIUA who attended the Webinar and the comments/suggestions provided by them have been noted by Delhi Development Authority.

Senior Officer from DDA addressed the participants and introduced the main objectives of the Webinar which was followed by a presentation by NIUA explaining the various plans and policies of the draft Master Plan-2041 related to Physical Infrastructure & Spatial Development Framework.

The major suggestions provided during the webinar were: rain water harvesting for parks and other open public places, fire safety compliance in commercial centres developed & maintained by agencies, management of existing dhalaos by local bodies, physical infrastructure provisions in green development area (GDA), development of decentralised waste water treatment systems and sanitation system, issue of water demand and waste water treatment in future regeneration schemes, managing water demand and reducing wastage of water, focus on use off-treated water, sharing of various background data & studies conducted while preparation of Master Plan for Delhi- 2041 with public.

The next webinar was organised by DDA on 16.07.2021 (Friday) from 03:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. in which discussions will covered chapters 19 to 22: Spatial Development Framework (Chapters 19, 20), Plan Monitoring and Evaluation (Chapter 21), Development Code and Development Control Norms (Chapter 22) of Draft MPD-2041.

#### WEBINAR ON 16.07.2021

Delhi Development Authority conducted an online Webinar on Master Plan of Delhi-2041 with the citizens of Delhi on 16<sup>th</sup> July 2021 from 03:00 pm to 04:30 pm. The purpose of the Webinar was to facilitate the general public to understand the plan provisions, various policies that have been made part of the draft Master Plan-2041, placed in public domain on 9<sup>th</sup> June, 2021 for inviting public suggestions and objections. This was the last online Webinar in a series of four webinars held between 01<sup>st</sup> July 2021 to 16<sup>th</sup> July 2021. In this webinar,

issues related to Chapter 19 to 22 i.e. Spatial Development Framework (Chapters 19, 20), Plan Monitoring and Evaluation (Chapter 21) and Development Code and Development Control Norms (Chapter 22) were presented. A total of 190 participants, including general public, Sr. Officers of DDA and NIUA attended the Webinar and the comments/suggestions provided by them have been noted by Delhi Development Authority.

Senior Officer from DDA addressed the participants and introduced the main objectives of the Webinar which was followed by a presentation by NIUA explaining the various plans and policies of the draft Master Plan-2041. The major issues/suggestions raised in the webinar were: promote and incentivise LSC/ CSC by provision of relaxed FAR and ground coverage, desealing and regularisation of buildings in DDA markets, include provision of life cycle costing analysis to ensure environmental and financial sustainability, allow amalgamation of DDA shops, request for prompt implementation of land pooling policy and GDA policy, safeguard all commercial activities on all notified and non-notified roads above 24 metre, add DCNs for in situ area-based upgradation of JJC's, discourage mixed land use, revision in parking norms, coordination between different govt. agencies for effective implementation of MPD-2041, integration of redevelopment process with PM-UDAY scheme, recognition of gender-based violence and informal economy in MPD-2041 and extension of timeline to submit objections and suggestions.

The participants were requested to submit their valuable suggestions on DDA online web portal for MPD-2041.

## CHAIRMAN STF REVIEWS PROGRESS AT 69<sup>TH</sup> STF MEETING

The 69<sup>th</sup> meeting of STF was held on 20.07.2021 wherein officers from all the local bodies and other concerned agencies were present. The progress of the complaints received up to 30<sup>th</sup> June was reviewed. In total 86386 complaints have been received in STF till 30<sup>th</sup> June 2021 and action on 82068 complaints has been initiated. 1284 ATR were received during the period from 16.06.2021 to 30.06.2021.

Since the constitution of STF in 2018, 3647 unauthorised constructions have been demolished and more than 2454 properties have been sealed. Chairman, STF directed the ULBs to take the matter of pendency seriously and expedite the action on the pending cases.

During 16.06.2021 to 30.06.2021, encroachment Removal was undertaken by NDMC at areas including Connaught Place, Palika Bazar, Gole Market, Janpath, Shanker Market, LBN, Sarojini Nagar and Chanakyapuri, and the VIP area during the fortnight. Encroachment removal drive was undertaken by SDMC at Bandh Road, Sangam Vihar on 19.06.2021, PVR Saket, Pramod Mahajan Road, Press Enclave Road on 22.06.2021 and Malviya Nagar Market, Hospital Road, School Road, Gol Chakkar on 28.06.2021. DDA removed 23 illegal/ unauthorised bore well behind Smritivan at Sarai Kale Khan to stop water extraction from Yamuna flood plains on 21/06/2021.



Two Joint demolition programmes were undertaken by North DMC and Revenue Deptt. in Burari. Area of land reclaimed is 7500 sq. mtr.

Chairman, STF reiterated that close co-ordinated efforts need to be continued by the ULBs & Govt. Agencies to take action for removal of encroachment in accordance with the law. Police Deptt. assured that all support shall be provided to remove the encroachment from roads and take action on unauthorized constructions effectively.

## HOUSING SCHEME 2021: DDA EXTENDS INTEREST FREE PERIOD FOR PAYMENTS

DDA has launched DDA Housing Scheme 2021 on 02.01.2021 which was open till 16.02.2021. The last date of payment of cost of flat (interest free) was 29.06.2021 except for the allottees of Dwarka Sector 16-B.

After having considered the situation due to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Wave of COVID-19, It has been decided to extend the last date for making payment/ cost of flats (interest free) by allottees of Housing Scheme 2021 without levy of interest except for the the allottees of Dwarka Sector 16-B up to 31.08.2021.

The extension of last date of interest-free payment up to 31.08.2021 is subject to the condition that the payment of the demanded amount is made within this extended period, otherwise benefit of extension will not be admissible to the allottees.



## HOUSING SCHEME 2019: DDA EXTENDS DEADLINE FOR PAYMENT OF COST OF FLAT

The last date of depositing demanded amount (cost of flat) for the allottees of Housing Scheme 2019 (with interest) has been extended up to 30.09.2021 subject to payment 10% interest on the cost from 01.11.2020 to 31.12.2020 and 14% penal interest for the remaining period i.e., from 01.01.2021 till 30.09.2021.

This extension will be applicable to all the allottees irrespective of the fact whether they have made any payment or not.
